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INTRODUCTION

“Ask, Seek, Knock Bible Study” may be conducted individually or within a group setting. This Bible study has been designed to be used with the Holy Bible (all scripture reference are King James Version unless otherwise denoted) and the following two books:

This Bible study: “Ask, Seek, Knock Bible Study” is divided into six studies, and includes radio sermons: Enter Into Thy Closet, Put On The Whole Armor, I Bow My Knees, Remove the Stones, Continue In Prayer, and Praying Always. These radio sermons are presented by Pastor Reimar Schultze. Pastor Schultze has been broadcasting the Call to Obedience Radio Ministry for over thirty years. He is a graduate of Asbury Seminary. Each of these 6 studies has been designed with a particular topic, and has required assignments. Studies 2 & 4 also offer fasting as an elective.

Below is a suggested agenda that you might consider using should you use this Bible study. If meeting in a group it is also recommended that the group meet 6 consecutive weeks to maintain and promote continuity during this Bible Study.

INTRODUCTION

Some other helpful hints to consider:

- >Pray that God will provide wisdom and understanding.
- >Find a place to meet that is conducive to study and to prayer.
- >Choose a Bible translation that you can understand.
- >Review
- >Come to the group prepared by having completed assignments.
- >Participate in the discussion, but be careful not to dominate.
- >Expect God to answer prayer.

The best preparation is prayer! You don't have to be a theologian or a Bible scholar to conduct or participate in a prayer study. It is more important that you allow the Holy Spirit to lead, guide, and direct. These studies, 1-6 as outlined below, may be used individually or in a group setting. Whether using them individually, or as a group, the time required to complete each topic may be no more than a day or may take a week depending on your schedule. It is important that you not rush through the materials, but wait upon God in prayer.

Example goal: I want to pray for the missionaries of my church while participating in this course on prayer. STUDY 1 CORPORATE PRAYER GOALS

Not only will each member have **ONE** prayer goal, but the group will select **THREE** prayer goals. Goals for a group might be praying for the pastoral ministry, salvation of souls, for the youth ministry, etc. Remember our focus in prayer is not “my will be done,” but “Thy will be done.” So often we pray selfishly. Enlarge your vision and begin to pray for His will. Below are some examples you might consider for group prayer goals. Let the Holy Spirit guide and direct, and be careful not to limit God! These three corporate prayer goals should be selected before going on to Study 2.

Example Goal: As a group we want to see revival in our church youth group. We want to pray that souls will be saved and revived. **Our Scripture to support this goal:** “... for as soon as Zion travailed, she brought forth her children.” Isaiah 66:8

Example Goal: As a group we want to see God open doors and expand our Pastor's ministry.
Our Scripture to support this goal: "I know thy works: behold, I have set before thee an open door, and no man can shut it: for thou hast a little strength, and hast kept my word, and hast not denied my name." Revelation 3:8

As you may well know, the problem of unanswered prayers is generally attributed to three categories:

God, Satan, or man. It is either that God is not willing, the devil is fighting, or man is not right with God when praying. We can find biblical support for all of these.

If something is not in the will of God, God has no interest in bringing it to pass. If something is in the will of God, the devil will fight it. If man is not right with God when praying, nothing much will be accomplished, even if it is God's will.

God, in His infinite wisdom, has made His actions dependent on the prayers of His people. He has, as the Revelation tells us, "made us unto our God kings and priests..." (Revelation 5:10). The Christian is born again to be a royal priest, or a priestly king. He can never be a king without being a priest, and he will never be a priest without being a king. We do govern, but we govern by prayer only. It is the prayers of saints (and our praises), and not our church statistics, that ascend to the throne of God (Revelation 8:3-4). Jesus said, "whatsoever thou shalt bind on earth shall be bound in heaven: and whatsoever thou shalt loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven." (Mathew 16:19). Jesus gave His disciples power to preach the gospel, to heal the sick, and power over the demons and the devil (Matthew 10: 7-8).

Jesus has given us power to change things. We are a royal priesthood. We are here to act in His behalf for the advancement of His kingdom. Why then do we have so many unanswered prayers when we pray in His behalf? The answer to that is simple, my friend: TO PRAY IN GOD'S WILL REQUIRES THAT WE LIVE IN GOD'S WILL. It is to not only keep His commandments, but ALSO to do that which is pleasing in His sight.

STUDY 1 ESSENTIALS TO ANSWERED PRAYER

You may pray for a sick son. It may be God's will to heal that sick son. But, it is much more in God's will for you to live in God's will 24 hours a day than for that son to be healed! When you have a petition, God wants you to come to him from the position of a royal priest—a godly person who keeps the commandments and does all that pleases God. God wants you to come to Him as a person walking with God and not as a backslider, a lukewarm Christian or a part-time Christian. God has absolutely no obligation to hear the prayers of people who are not all for God. He may, in His mercy, act upon such requests, but He is not obligated to do so.

People who neither keep the commandments, nor do that which pleases God, are not in a place of authority to have their prayers heard. They do not have God's interest at heart, but their own.

When they pray for healing, they have their own interests in mind. When they pray for finance, they have their own interests in mind. When they pray for sanctification, or spiritual gifts, or even for their marriage to be restored or for their children or spouse to be saved, they have their own interests in mind. It is their own happiness that is vital to them, as well as the happiness of those about them.

You may keep all the laws of God, but not do that which is pleasing in His sight. You may not kill, you may not commit adultery, you may keep the Sabbath holy, you may honor your father and mother; YET, you may watch television programs that have violence, adultery, nakedness or foolishness in them. You may watch programs that bring leanness to your soul—programs that are not pleasing in His sight. If you do so, you may take yourself out of 1 John 3:22, and have to settle for a lot of unanswered prayers.

I can hardly say this all without losing some friends and making others mad, but I must do so to give an answer for the many unanswered prayers. We get no credit for doing our duty or for keeping the law. Our credit comes when we go beyond law and our fixed responsibilities, and we allow our love to God and man to unfold itself in pleasing service (Luke 17:10). We must keep one eye on the commandments, but the other on the heart of God so as not to grieve Him.

As Mother Teresa said: “Prayer is simply talking to God...” and it is “a two-way process.” Have you been faithful to talk to God each day? Burden bearers are draftees. Intercessors are volunteers. Some of you may be both!

The primary means by which God's will is to be done in earth is by prayer. In reference to the kingdom of God and the will of God on earth, it has been said that God does nothing but in answer to prayer. This is a great mystery. And until you accept that mystery as a reality to be dealt with 1) you will not pray much, 2) your whole Christian life will be off-center, and 3) you will miss what you are a Christian for.

It is an astounding fact that the destiny of events have been placed in the hands of praying men. PRAY, "Thy will be done!" If we pray for God's will to be done, it will be done! If we don't pray for His will to be done, the devil will have his way. This is one of the greatest lessons in the Bible. After God created man, He gave man dominion, power and authority over all things on the earth (Genesis 1:20). God made man the keeper of the earth. He could do that because man was in His likeness. Then man sinned; his heart became wicked. Since then Satan, through man, has corrupted the world. Satan became the prince of the world. Paul gives a sobering description of the forces the devil has unleashed in this world in Ephesians 6, "For we wrestle not with flesh and blood, but against the despotism, against the powers, against world rulers of this present darkness, against the spirit forces of wickedness..." (Amplified Bible). Now one would assume that Christians would crowd into churches for prayer meetings more than for preaching or gospel concerts or Sunday school. For nothing is better than God's will, and prayer ushers in that will. There is no greater guarantee for success and fulfillment than in the will of God. One would think that Christians would spend more time on their knees than watching television. One would think that every church would have at least one REAL prayer meeting—packed out. But such is not the case.

The reason why prayer is not popular or well attended to, is because most Christians do not want God's will to be done, except when it coincides with their own wills. Thus we pray for relief from sickness, but not for God's will to be done on our vacation. Thus we pray for our ten percent to be used correctly by the church, but we will not let God's will enter into the ninety percent we keep.

STUDY 2 INTERCESSORY PRAYER

Carnality does not want God's will to be done except when that will agrees with its own preferences—which leads me say that if we do not covet all of God's will all of the time, we can have no confidence to have some of His will some of the time. "The effectual fervent prayer of a righteous man availeth much." (James 5:16).

Now then, let us look at the nature, the character and the method of the intercessor.

"And he said unto them, Which of you shall have a friend, and shall go unto him at midnight, and say unto him, Friend, lend me three loaves; For a friend of mine in his journey is come to me, and I have nothing to set before him?" (Luke 11:5-6). The intercessor is a man who has two friends. The one is rich; the other is poor. The one has everything; the other lacks in essentials.

The intercessor has one friend in heaven, and he, in the story mentioned here, has many needy friends on earth. The intercessor stands between the one who has and the one who has not, and he, through believing, and through persevering prayer, transfers the goods from the all-sufficient, abounding one to the destitute one. The intercessor brings God's will down to earth.

He is called upon at an inconvenient time. As we see, the intercessor is called upon at any time of the day. Yet he does not mind, for his life is "thy will be done." Consequently, his life is prayer. Our text says that "he had nothing to set before him." He could have used that as an excuse for sending the traveler on, but the law of the kingdom is as the Middle Eastern law of hospitality which allows for no excuses. The intercessor is compassionate. The intercessor is self-denying. The intercessor is industrious. The intercessor waits on God.

This intercessor had been without food. We don't know for how long. He had "nothing to set before him." Yet, despite the fact that he had nothing to eat for a day or two, the intercessor did not have courage to petition his wealthy friend. He simply waited on God until he had a promise that would give him certain passage to the heart of his prosperous friend. For the promise, the petition that pleases the Father is never "give me day by day my daily bread," but rather "give us our daily bread!" The intercessor knows that in petitioning he must never think of his needs apart from the needs of others. He must have a larger end in mind than just himself. For the law of deliverance is found in "he that loseth his life... shall find it."(Mathew 10:39).The coming of the friend at mid-night to his home, which was a place of waiting on God, a place of trusting, a place of love, a place of compassion, and a place of self-denial, was the beginning of the answer to everyone's need in the house. If your home is such a place, God will never be far from it.

Being now able to lose his life for a friend, being now able to pray the divinely blessed petition, "Give us our daily bread." with courage, excitement and thrill, the intercessor launches into the dark, cold night. While the village is sound asleep, while his guest is now comfortably settled in his bed, the intercessor, although physically exhausted from the lack of food, suddenly finds new strength. He finds the strength that comes from doing the will of God even as he has learned that strength from his rich friend who said, "My meat is to do the will of him that sent me." (John 4:34).

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STUDY 2

INTERCESSORY PRAYER

So we see this shadowy figure making his way swiftly through the streets and alleys, disregarding the dangers lurking in the dark. The intercessor has a petition that cannot be denied: "Give US this day our daily bread!" Hallelujah! He does not hesitate on his way to his friend for he has walked this path to the door of mercy more than any other way.

He positions himself at the door of his rich friend. It is now midnight. It is cold, it is dark, and he is the only one awake, but awake with excitement, faith, determination and anticipation. The intercessor thrusts his knuckles against the door, yet his repetitive thrusts bring no answer. Undeterred from the lack of response, he renews his efforts with greater diligence. He knocks, and he knocks, and he knocks. To him it is not a question of 'if' but of 'when' for he has a

promise from the one he is trying to rouse. "Every one that asketh receiveth; and he that seeketh findeth; and to him that knocketh it shall be opened." (Luke 11:10).

The intercessor cannot be denied once he prays the Father's will, for we read that "What things soever ye desire, when ye pray, believe that ye receive them, and ye shall have them." (Mark 11:24). He also knows that to doubt is to lose (v. 23). He remembers the words of his rich friend which he had heard him say so often, "Have faith in God." (v. 22). And if the delay is long, he knows it is only to strengthen his character, his will, his faith, his steadfastness, and his self-denial for other matters that are yet ahead.

Finally, the answer comes from within, "I cannot come..." The night goes on. Even though he hears the words of his friend, "I cannot come," the intercessor knows better. He knows the heart of his friend which says: "Keep asking, keep knocking, keep coming, keep pressing."

Paul said: “And I, brethren, could not speak unto you as unto spiritual, but as unto carnal, even as unto babes in Christ. For ye are yet carnal...” (1 Corinthians 3:1,3)

In “A Voice in the Wilderness,” it says:

At a place of prayer, God meets us; and in His presence we become aware that it is expedient for us to be crucified. With great agony of soul we acknowledge that all carnal traits must be removed, obliterated, and cleansed out of our heart and mind by the blood of Jesus. We are not able to do this ourselves. We cannot arrange this or accomplish this on our own. God can only perform this through individuals who are willing to remain in His hand, willing to wait in His purpose until He is able to cleanse from them these weaknesses; until He is able to take from them all things that mar, deter, hurt, crush, and cause the Holy Spirit to be grieved with us. (pg.231-232)

Notice that we in ourselves cannot remove these carnal traits, but we cannot excuse them either. As we wait on God in prayer and remain in His will, we are cleansed. Take time to pray right now and ask Jesus to cleanse you of these carnal traits you circled. Self-denial is essential in the elimination of these traits. Example: As I go to work one morning, I am caught in a very bad traffic jam. Within my heart, I become irritated and angry. At this point, I must crucify the selfish nature that wants to become angry and irritated. I can immediately ask Jesus to help me and to cleanse me. Or I can become angry, irritable, honk the horn, and have a bad day. Pray that God will give you the grace to resist responding in a carnal and selfish way. Pray that God will give you a new heart.

“A new heart also will I give you, and a new spirit will I put within you: and I will take away the stony heart out of your flesh, and I will give you an heart of flesh. And I will put my spirit within you, and cause you to walk in my statutes, and ye shall keep my judgments, and do them.” Ezekiel 36:26-27

STUDY 4 STRONGHOLDS

“For though we walk (live) in the flesh, we are not carrying on our warfare according to the flesh and using mere human weapons, for the weapons of our warfare are not physical (weapons of flesh and blood), but they are mighty before God for the overthrow and the destruction of strongholds, (inasmuch as we) refute arguments and theories and reasoning’s and every proud and lofty thing that sets itself up against the (true) knowledge of God: and we lead every thought and purpose away captive into obedience of Christ (The Messiah, The Anointed One), being in readiness to punish every (insubordinate for his) disobedience, when you’re own submission and obedience (as a church) are fully secured and complete.” 2 Corinthians 10:3-5 Amplified

What are strongholds?

1. Strongholds are anything and everything that prevents the Word of God from advancing.
2. Strongholds are those things that cause suffering.
3. Strongholds are whatever denies Christians their rights to worship, to meet together, and to pray.
4. Strongholds are that which deny the Sonship Jesus Christ.
5. Strongholds are what keep people in darkness and in ignorance.

We must be careful not to have any strongholds in our own life. We also must realize that we cannot break down all strongholds with our own strength. We need to pray and ask God what strongholds we are to attack and once we know God's will, then we pray and pray and pray until that stronghold is broken.

STUDY 5 IMPORTUNITY

GEORGE MULLER

In November, 1844, I began to pray for the conversion of five individuals. I prayed every day without a single intermission, whether sick or in health, on the land or on the sea, and whatever the pressure of my engagements might be.

Eighteen months elapsed before the first of five was converted. I thanked God and prayed on for the others.

Five years elapsed, and then the second was converted. I thanked God for the second, and

prayed on for the other three.

Day by day I continued to pray for them, and **six years** passed before the third was converted. I thanked God for the three and went on praying for the other two.

These two remained unconverted.

“The man to whom God in the riches of his grace has given tens of thousands of answers to prayer in the self-same hour or day in which they were offered has been praying day by day for nearly **36 years** for the conversion of these individuals, and yet they remain unconverted. But I hope in God, I pray on, and look yet for the answer. They are not converted yet, but they will be.”

This was the faith that carried him through every difficult place. He met emergencies by asking and in due time God supplied whatever the need might be.

Were those prayers unanswered you ask? In 1897, those two men, sons of a friend of Mr. Muller's youth, were not yet converted, after he had entreated God in their behalf for **52 years** daily. But after his death, God brought them into the fold. -- *George Muller* by Basil Miller pg. 146

It is so important that we pray effectively. "But when ye pray, use not vain repetitions, as the heathen do: for they think that they shall be heard for their much speaking." Matthew 6:7 The above list is an excellent resource for review.
